Adoptive parents understand what it's like to have an emptiness in their hearts, to search, to set out on a mission, to take responsibility for a child with a troubled past and an uncertain future. And that's what God did for you. Knowing full well the trouble you'd be, and what it would cost, He sought you, found you, paid the price for you, took you home, gave you His name and the right to call Him "Abba", which means "Father", a term of endearment.

Adoption isn't something you earn, it's a gift you receive. You'd never hear adoptive parents say, "We'd like to adopt little Mary but first we want to know—does she have a house, money for tuition, a ride to school in the morning and clothes to wear every day?"

The adoption agency would say, "Hold on, you're not adopting her because of what she has, but because of what she needs. She needs love, hope, a home and a future."

We don't earn the Spirit of adoption, we receive it by faith. That's important, because if we can't gain it by your efforts, we can't lose it through our poor performance. How reassuring! And it gets better; we'll never have a need He cannot or will not meet.

How good is that?!



Reviewing the 2014 spending plan approved by the voters' \$462,500 in offerings is what would be necessary to fully fund the budget.

Through November 30, 2014 \$348,894 has been received in general fund offerings.

Note - the items included in general fund above other than offerings include preschool and facility use.

The total budget passed for 2014's ministry spending plan was \$489,350.

Through 11/30 we have incurred general fund expenses of \$396,126 - which represents 80.95% of the total. Through 11/30 we have received general fund income of \$376,707 - which represents 76.98% of the total.

Remember that at the beginning of this year (2014), we started with a surplus of \$39,454, compared to a deficit of (\$47,137) at the beginning of the prior year (2013).

As we begin the process of budget preparation and planning for next year, I request that you prayerfully consider the Mission and Vision of Trinity Lutheran Church and become involved in the process, which starts with discussion by the Church Leadership Council. Check the calendar for the budget discussion meeting and the Voters' meeting when the plan for 2015 is discussed and voted on.

PRESENT: Marty Nusser, Lisa Hogan, Bob Drees, Ron Hall, Heidi Berg, DCE Leland Jackson, DCE Cynthia Lavrenz, Buddy Skeie, Jay Meyer, Mike Reagle and Judy Schweer

ABSENT: Rachelle Powell and Loretta Schultz

GUESTS: Katy Pauley

Jay Meyer called the meeting to order. The opening devotion from a View from the Zoo was led by DCE Cynthia Lavrenz. Prayer concerns were shared and DCE Cynthia Lavrenz than led the group in prayer.

CONSENSUS APPROVAL ITEMS: Minutes of the 8/21/14 and 9/18/14 meetings were presented. Heidi Berg moved the minutes be approved and Buddy Skeie seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

REPORTS:

Website: Lisa Hogan met with DCE Leland Jackson, DCE Cynthia Lavrenz, Katy Pauley, Karl Paschel and Buddy Skeie on Wednesday. The information required was provided to the staff and they have until November 1st to submit the needed information to Karl. The goal is preview the website at the next CLC meeting.

Long Range Planning Committee: It was reported that Spaghetti Dinner was postponed. Future fund-raisers included the November 2nd Circuit Rally meal, Thrivent Event on November 23rd, Hall Wedding Rehearsal on January 2nd and possibly a pancake meal. DCE Cynthia Lavrenz announced that the funds raised from the upcoming bazaar will be earmarked for the Building Fund. Buddy Skeie reported that a handicap accessible door will be installed in the East Ed Meeting Room and that there is a need for additional classroom space. Dividing the East Ed Meeting Room was discussed along with the need that the wall have some type of opening that would still allow use of the area as a large room.

Narthex Remodel: Buddy Skeie reported that by the end of next week the bathrooms should be in working order. The handicap bathroom in the Fellowship Hall is temporarily out of order and Buddy is working with R J Plumbing on a resolution. The new phone system has been installed and is working great though the phone in the nursery needs to be moved.

Preschool Items: Jay Meyer reported that the Preschool is requesting that the water fountain by the Preschool needs to be in working order as soon as possible. Buddy Skeie stated that the part is on order. Jay also reported that the ABCD Board would like to install better signage for the Preschool for which they have the idea and funds. Martin Nusser moved that approval be given to the ABCD Board to proceed with the Preschool signage using their funds. Lisa Hogan seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Jay Meyer stated that there was no report available but that Loretta Schultz had reported to him that she will try to have an up to date report in the newsletter. It was also stated that the Concordia Plan Renewal deadline has passed so the current plan will be continued for 2015.

OLD BUSINESS:

Custodian Position Review: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that the review, with all staff members including the Preschool teachers, has been completed and signed. Any CLC member can meet with Cynthia privately to read the review. There several areas of improvement but she stated that Rick Beltz's first 90 days, with the fast hiring and the remodeling, did not allow for a smooth start. Cynthia is recommending that we continue on "as is" for now and CLC members agreed.

Circuit Visitor Nomination: Judy Schweer read an E Mail from Rev. Andrew Wehling stating that the nomination was due September 1st and that five nominations were received. All nominations were for Rev. Wehling and the election was conducted by Circuit Forum President Rev. Warren Prochnow via E Mail rather than having a meeting. It was also announced that nominations for District President and Vice President are due by November 30th.

Intentional Interim Pastor: Ron Hall reported that he had contacted Rev. Martin Schrader, who serves on the Board of Directors for the Intentional Interim Pastor Program for a method of obtaining additional names for Intentional candidates for multi-staff churches. Rev. Schrader has accepted a call to the Baltimore area. Ron also reported that he had heard positive comments regarding Rev. Griffin's visit. He further reported that Rev. Griffin is still considering Garden City along with 3 other churches and will be making a decision within 3 weeks. Discussion followed on options if an Intentional cannot be found and the consensus was that working with TCN is a possible Plan B.

New Business:

Preschool Teachers Contracts: Jay Meyer reported that he has received the contracts from the ABCD Board and that they are the same as last year with about a 3% raise. Discussion followed. Buddy Skeie moved that the Preschool Teachers Contracts be approved as proposed. Martin Nusser seconded and the motion passed by a voice vote.

Crisis Management Plan: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that for the Preschool to be licensed they are required to have a Crisis Management Plan. Cynthia and Katy Pauley along with the Preschool Teachers will research and work on the plan than present to CLC for approval. Mike Reagle stated that the Garden City Police are available to review the property and help with the plan.

Adventure Crew: The Adventure Crew would like to work with Trinity. The CLC requested that they make a presentation at the next CLC meeting so that there is a better understanding of their requirements, needs and expectations along with the opportunity for CLC to ask guestions.

Wireless Router: DCE Leland Jackson stated that he felt that Trinity would benefit from having a wireless router. He was directed by CLC to obtain bids from Frank Schmale with Team Electronics and Cox Communications. Mike Reagle agreed to work with Leland on obtaining the bids.

Community Thanksgiving Service: DCE Leland Jackson reported that at the last Ministerial Alliance meeting it was announced that no Community Thanksgiving Service is scheduled and that most of the churches that were present do not do any type of special Thanksgiving service. Leland proposed that Trinity's Thanksgiving Eve service become the Community service and since we are in vacancy perhaps one of the Community Pastors could do the service. Discussion followed. Consensus of CLC was that the Community will be invited to Trinity's Thanksgiving Eve Supper and Service but that it will be a Lutheran service but with no communion. Buddy Skeie will talk to Pastor Gumz from Lakin/Ulysses about conducting the service and if he is not available he will talk to Pastor Prochnow from Scott City.

Carport for Bus and Trailer: DCE Leland Jackson stated that there was a need to build a carport for the Bus and Trailer, which would protect them from the weather. CLC requested that he get bids to be discussed at the next CLC Meeting.

The next meeting is November 20, 2014 at 6:30 p.m.

Jay Meyer adjourned the meeting and closed with The Lord's Prayer.
