All Hat, No Cattle

And Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you. But whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:42-45)

The old cowboy idiom "all hat, no cattle" was popularized by President George W. Bush as he brought Texas folksiness to the White House. It's a colorful way to level criticism on someone who is more concerned with how they look than what they do. It's an age-old problem amongst us who call ourselves "good" Christians, and one that John the Baptist addressed when observing the Pharisees and Sadducees.

You see, when any of us operate out of our own self-interest (and "better than thou" sinfulness") it doesn't take long to become enamored with the trappings and traditions of recognition. Clothes that make us stand out in a crowd as righteous, special greetings, preferred seating at church events, the spotlight shining on us as we're introduced at a service or in a Bible class. I understand that this doesn't apply to everyone, but please be honest with yourself the next time you find yourself wishing it were you getting the special recognition for how holy and righteous you are.

Recognition isn't a bad thing. We all appreciate it when our work is acknowledged in some way, whether large or small. It's when we *crave* recognition whether we've actually done anything or not. In that case, that we are at risk of leaving behind God's call to serve and work, so that we will be applauded.

The greater condemnation from Christ isn't reserved for those who do nothing, but for those who make themselves out to be great in the eyes of the Lord while *making a pretense* of doing something



Loooooonnngg Range Planning News

As we look around the newly-redone narthex, nursery, restrooms, meeting rooms, entry doors, and hall-ways we can see that God is good. The congregation rallied and decided upon and completed many projects. We give thanks for the teamwork that made this happen. You might have swung a paintbrush or hammer, operated a screwdriver, donated furniture, food or participated in a meal. Thank you for your wonderful effort. This project has many parents, who together made it happen.

Now as we enter the repayment period, there are several areas that continue to benefit from our parenting. The Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) is a financial organization that empowers ministry. The voters authorized a loan with LCEF up to the amount of \$200,000. The loan is in place but has not yet been funded due to sufficient cash flow.

The interest rate for the loan can decrease if Trinity has 34 accounts with them. This is a great opportunity for you to begin a savings plan for yourself, spouse, children, grandchildren. With an opening deposit of \$25 your account has the potential to lower the interest from 4.125 to 3.5, which represents a savings of 491.14 each year for the life of the loan. Dillon's Neighborhood Reward Program THANK YOU and Program Recap



First of all, I'd like to apologize to Leland and Cynthia for dragging my feet when they first brought this program to my attention. It had been used by a church in Emporia and Wichita with great success. I, personally, was skeptical about how it would work and whether it would be worth the hassle that I perceived it would cause. However, in late 2012 I agreed that I would "investigate" the program and report back my thoughts.

After talking to the Dillons representative in Hutchinson, as well as Elaine, the DCE in Emporia, we decided to go ahead with the program. So, I completed the paperwork necessary, in the newsletter we publicized the program and how it would work. We got our first 50 cards in January, 2013. The decision was made to split any funds received as follows: 30% - Education; 30% - Youth; 30% - Capital Improvement and 10% - Deficit Reduction. This was changed to 1/3 each to Education, Youth and Capital Improvement when we ended 2013 without a deficit.

If only we could see how things would work out – If only I (we) had known then what we know now – I (we) would have signed TLC up for the program when we first heard of it. We ordered 50 cards again in March 2013 and October 2013, and placed our final order for 25 cards in December 2013.

Our total investment in the 175 cards was \$1,750 cards, which we recouped when the cards were sold for the \$10 each that was on the reloadable gift cards. Each individual's investment in the card was \$10, which was recouped when they spent the \$10 that was loaded on the card. So, no one had really any money invested or spent on the cards.

God is Good! Very Good! During 2013, from January 23 through November 30, our members and friends reloaded those cards with a total of \$62,850.67! Trinity received 5% of that for a total of \$3,142.53!! Amazing!!!

From January 2014 through January 31, 2015 – our members and friends reloaded the cards with a total of \$75,032.68!!! Trinity received 5% of that for a total of \$3,751.63! Simply Amazing! Thanks Be To GOD!!!

SO – the final tally is: 175 cards; \$137,883.35 loaded on the cards; \$6,894.16 received! 1/3 each to: Education/Family Life, Youth, Capital Improvement = \$2,298.06 each.

A huge THANK YOU to our members and friends for supporting this program!!!

After that kind of success, and the tremendous participation, I was heartbroken to receive a letter from Dillons in December that the program was going to end effective January 31, 2015, and would be replaced with a new program – Community Rewards.

There have been articles and information shared about the new program. In a nutshell – it looks to be much easier and possibly appealing to more of our members and friends.

Effective February 1, 2015, you can earn rewards on almost any purchase every time you shop at Dillons or Kwik Shop, simply by swiping your Dillons Plus Shopper's card (or putting your alternate ID – i.e., your phone number). To continue, or begin, supporting Trinity through Community Rewards, visit www.dillons.com/communityrewards and enroll your Plus Shopper's Card in the program, and be sure to select Trinity Lutheran Church, Garden City, Kansas as recipient organization. TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH – VOTERS' MEETING MINUTES OF THE MEETING NOVEMBER 9, 2014, 11:45 A.M.

Fifty eight people signed the attendance roster.

Jay Meyer called the meeting to order and Ron Hall opened with prayer.

Minutes from the June 1, 2014 Voters' meeting was presented. Kelly Lange moved and Rick Beltz seconded that the minutes be approved. The motion passed by voice vote.

There was no old business to be acted upon.

The floor was opened for new business.

Jay Meyer and Ron Hall presented information on the Intentional Interim Pastor candidate Timm Griffin. They stated that there are very few Intentional Interim candidates available with Multi-Staff training, and Pastor Griffin qualifies! The position is a contract position but still requires a Divine Call from the congregation. The pastor will work every day during a three week period, then have one week off. The contract is a 13-month contract with the 13th month off. The District's base salary is \$31,525.00 with multipliers for years of service, education and the intentional training. Loretta Schultz has reviewed the figures and applied the appropriate multipliers for this candidate and arrived at a base salary of \$123,000.00. Loretta Schultz also reported that as of October 31, 2014, Trinity has a current year deficit of (\$21,000.00) but with the beginning surplus of \$39,000.00, we are currently at \$18,000.00. The floor was opened for questions. Jay Meyer clarified that the candidate will make his own living arrangements and pay for that cost out of his salary.

Connie Jo Bailey moved that Trinity Lutheran Church extend a Divine Call to Pastor Timm Griffin to serve as the Intentional Interim Pastor. Paul Pauley seconded the motion; discussion followed. After lengthy discussion, Gerry Schultz called the question and voting was approved by a voice vote. Voting was conducted by show of hands with 43 – Yes, 5 – No and the rest abstained. Jay Meyer declared the motion carried. The Lay Ministers are recommending the Divine Call and a salary with a 1.2 multiplier. Discussion followed. Kelly Lange moved that Trinity Lutheran Church extend a Divine Call to Pastor Timm Griffin with a salary and benefits limit of \$125,000.00. Jonathan Bailey seconded the motion and discussion followed.

Voting was done by a show of hands and the motion carried. Ron Hall reported that Pastor Timm Griffin has stated that we would have an answer by early December. Gerry Schultz moved that if Pastor Timm Griffin accepts the Call, that the final contract approval be given to the Lay Ministers. Connie Jo Bailey seconded the motion and the motion passed by voice vote.

The floor was opened for nominations for District President and Vice President. Leland Jackson moved that Trinity Lutheran Church nominate Rev. Scott Snow from Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Wichita as District President. Gerry Schultz seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote. No nominations were presented for the Vice President position at this time. Kelly Lange moved that if any nominations were later presented that the Church Leadership Council could make the nomination in the congregation's behalf. Carlene Schweer seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote.

There was no further business to be brought before the Voters.

Alice Banning moved to adjourn. Bernice Robinson seconded and the motion passed by voice vote. Respectfully Submitted,
