Crying On The Inside

Night and day among the tombs and in the hills

he would cry out and cut himself with stones. Mark 5:5

Jesus crossed the Sea of Galilee in a storm to meet with a disturbed man. There were plenty of others in need, but He especially chose to find this man who was literally troubled by his inner demons. Jesus did it because, although this man seemed so fierce and tough on the outside, on the inside *'he was... crying.'* This man certainly hated who he'd become. He despised the situation he was in. This man was also totally powerless to release himself from his inner bondage. How about you? Are you tormented and crying on the inside because of how your life has turned out? Maybe you intended to be a better parent, a more faithful partner, an honest employee or an exemplary leader? But things did not work out the way you planned, and now you are in a mess.

Jesus said, 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for right-eousness, for they shall be filled' (Matthew 5:6). Wanting to change is the first step! Thank God Jesus never said, 'Blessed are those who are good enough already,' or we'd all be in big trouble! No, He was talking to those who long to do the right thing, and to be made right inside, and at peace on the inside..

Please note and believe that it is not what you have done that makes you a candidate for God's help and forgiveness. It is your need. The message of the cross and the empty tomb is about what He has done and can do for you. Do not let how you feel about what you have done, or how are responding to what has been done to you, discourage you or make you lash out at God and at others. Christ did not come to this earth to condemn you. Nor did He sacrifice Himself upon the cross for you only to then let you live a life of self-condemnation and despair. On the contrary, He came to save you from every form of condemnation. Know this: Christ will never condemn you for asking for His help. In fact, deliverance is His purpose and power for you. It now behooves you to turn to Him with a desire, and a willingness, to challenge your problems by calling on Jesus' name.

So what is your heart's cry today? What do you want to change about yourself and your life? Get alone with Jesus. Open His Word. Open your heart to prayer. Reach out to God and seek His help. Jesus is there, desiring to relieve your burdened soul with His love and forgiveness. He will not disappoint, but He can and will save. It is why He came!



GUESTS: Katy Pauley

Jay Meyer called the meeting to order. Opening devotion was led by Pastor Timm Griffin, based on Genesis 28:14, tied to the invention of the typewriter in 1867.

CONSENSUS APPROVAL ITEMS: Minutes of the 12/18/14 and 1/22/2015 meetings were presented. Robert Drees moved the minutes be approved and Buddy Skeie seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

REPORTS:

Lay Ministry: Pastor reported that the Lay Ministers are working to schedule meetings.

Staff: Pastor Timm Griffin presented a preliminary Report on Interim Goals, outlining answers from the cottage meetings. Pastor wants to have the Task Force chosen before the next CLC meeting. In discussion about two services it appears that attendance between the two services is similar to when there was one service. Discussion followed about informing the congregation of any changes proposed. Pastor shared information about the summer vicarage; he has a candidate in mind; he is finishing his degree and may want to do mission work in Taiwan. Discussion and consensus was that pastor should continue communicating with this possible candidate.

Leland shared that he is taking 86 to Mexico to build 3 houses.

Website: Trinity's website is an ongoing project; Karl is waiting on some information in order to finish. Buddy asked about the thumb drive. Discussion followed about copyrighted photos.

Treasurer's report: Loretta shared Profit & Loss sheets and the budget approved January 15, 2015. The LCEF loan has not been needed, and the paperwork approved by LCEF in September will remain current for one year.

Long Range Planning/Narthex Remodel: Recent projects brought in \$200. Leland shared that the youth would like to see only the long-arm room and showers added, not the additional classroom. Pastor commended the youth for sharing their opinion. Discussion followed about the voters' decision, expandable walls. Buddy Skeie shared that Ed Barb will be the leader of the project and that it may begin in mid-May.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion was held on the ongoing review of Trinity's Financial Records. The goal is to report to CLC in May, so the team needs to have information before a possible meeting on April 12.

NEW BUSINESS:

Katy showed the weather radio and shared that Steve Hamann is able to open the building to those seeking refuge during severe weather. He will get a key soon. She referred to the Disaster Preparedness article by Rocky Meese.

Pastor proposed a portable sound system capable of supporting 8 microphones. \$800 from Amazon, it is comparable to systems at a higher price. Mike Reagle moved and Lisa Hogan seconded that the system by purchased using Thrivent Choice dollars. Motion passed by voice vote.

Katy reported that Carlene Schweer needs to use the facility for a one-hour workshop on March 19 at 10:00. Pastor voiced that this is a positive community relationship. Consensus was to allow the use.

Leland proposed building an awning for some equipment, and consensus was to delegate Long Range Planning Team to discuss.

The next meeting is April 16, 2015 at 6:30 p.m. Meeting was adjourned.
