On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!" John 20:19

Have you faltered? Max Lucado writes: "This is Peter denying Jesus. His feet walked on water. His hands distributed the miracle food to the five thousand. His eyes saw Moses and Elijah standing next to Jesus on Transfiguration Hill. His lips swore allegiance: *"Not even if I have to die with You! I will never deny You"* (Matthew 26:35). And Peter wasn't the only one: 'All the other disciples vowed the same' (see Matthew 26:33-35). But before the dark became dawn, *'...all His disciples deserted Him and ran away'* (Mark 14:50). John, Andrew, James . . . men who are today "stained-glassed" in a thousand cathedrals spent the night. . . hiding. They abandoned Him and ran away . . . But even more amazing is this - **when Christ rose from the dead He never brought it up. Not even one 'I told you so.'**

Entering the Upper Room He could have quoted their own words, reminding them of their betrayal. "Boy, Andrew, some friend you are. And, John, to think I was going to let you write one of the Gospels." He could have turned on His heel and walked out of the room, but He did not. Listen: *"That evening, on the first day of the week, the disciples were meeting behind locked doors because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders. Suddenly, Jesus was standing there among them!" "Peace be with you," he said (John 20:19).* They outran the guards, but they could not outrun His love. Neither can you.

No matter how badly you have faltered, Jesus loves you, has great plans for you, and, if you will let Him, He will redeem you and restore you!

MINUTES OF THE MEETING 5/14/2015 6:30 p.m.

PRESENT: Pastor Timm Griffin, Ron Hall, DCE Cynthia Lavrenz, DCE Leland Jackson, Martin Nusser, Bob Drees, Jay Meyer, Rachelle Powell, Buddy Skeie, Lisa Hogan and Judy Schweer

ABSENT: Heidi Berg, Mike Reagle and Loretta Schultz

Jay Meyer called the meeting to order. Pastor Timm Griffin presented a devotion based on Philippians 4:8 and prayer concerns were shared.

CONSENSUS APPROVAL ITEMS: Minutes of the 4/16/15 meeting were presented. Corrections were discussed. Buddy Skeie moved the minutes be accepted with noted corrections and Rachelle Powell seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

REPORTS:

Questions to and/or Comments from Staff:

(1) Pastor Timm Griffin reported that the Staff is currently working on their self-evaluations and that we are on track to form a Call Committee at the June Voters Meeting. He also stated that the District President and Circuit Counselor will be attending the June Voters Meeting.

(2) DCE Cynthia Lavrenz shared that Ladies Night Out was great and reminded everyone about the Aspen Phillips fundraiser on Sunday. She reported that the new Stephen Ministers are about half through their 50 hours of training and that the current Stephen Ministers will be continuing their education on the last Sunday of each month at 10:30 a.m. starting in May. She has also been working on Summer Sunday School, which will be Jesus 24/7-365, along with updating and making new plans for confirmation.

(3) DCE Leland Jackson shared that the Men's Retreat entitled "Fear Not" was an impactful weekend. He is currently working on the Baccalaureate Service which will be on May 16th at 10:00 a.m. He will be attending the Memorial Weekend Event at LVR and currently has 1 family signed up for the trip to the Creation Museum. He also shared that the summer High School Wednesday program started last night (5/13) and that 10 youth are signed up for summer camp.

Website: Website is up and the address is tlcgck.org. Work is still in progress and please let the office and/or staff know if there are any corrections that need to be made.

Stewardship: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that starting May 31st the bulletin will weekly contain Year-to-Date Income and Expense information with figures to be revised monthly. She also reported that the committee is planning a Budgeting Event for the Jr. and Sr. High youth along with their parents and mentors for the first 2 Wednesday's of September and that there will also be an Adult Event to be led by Gerry Schultz.

Task Force: Rachelle Powell reported that they are meeting weekly on Monday's and that they are working on clarification of Trinity's vision and a job description for the upcoming pastoral call.

Nominating Committee: Ron Hall reported that nominations are due by May 31st. He is working on forming the committee.

Treasurer's Report: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz distributed the report prepared by Loretta Schultz for January through April, 2015 (see attached). She also reported that Loretta stated that all bills have been paid for the remodeling with an outstanding balance of \$100,000.00. Discussion followed. Three questions were formatted that Judy Schweer will E Mail to Loretta with a request that they be answered via E Mail prior to the next CLC meeting.

Old Business:

Portable Speaker: Pastor Timm Griffin reported that the speaker is here and ready to be used. The cost was approximately \$800.00. He also reported that the new computers are here and have been installed with a working battery backup. He also stated that 3 of the new computers have Web Cams and those computers are being used by Pastor and DCEs.

Summer Vicar: Pastor Timm Griffin reported that Trinity would not have a summer vicar as there are no candidates available.

Financial Review Status: Lisa Hogan reported that the review process will start on May 19th. It was determined that there was no additional old business.

New Business:

Heating/AC Unit: Buddy Skeie announced that the unit in the Preschool area stopped working last week and that Unger's installed a new unit. Installation was authorized by Pastor Timm Griffin.

Fire Extinguishers: Buddy Skeie recommended that Trinity look into a different vendor for the servicing of the church's fire extinguishers as he thought an agreement with a better value was a possibility. He recommended Larry with Pro LLC Enterprises. Martin Nusser volunteered to research and report back to CLC.

PieceMakers: Jay Meyer shared a report from the group (see attached) and stated that the District has requested an article on their work for the Workers Together section of the Lutheran Witness.

District Correspondence: Jay Meyer read a request from District for a donation for retiring President Kohlmeier. Discussion followed. No action was taken.

Announcements:

Voters Meeting will be Sunday, June 28th at 1:00 p.m.

The next meeting is meeting will be Wednesday, June 10th at 6:30 p.m.

Jay Meyer adjourned the meeting and closed with The Doxology.

At the January Voters' Meeting, a budget – ministry spending plan – was adopted in the amount of \$577,195. If all budgeted items were fully spent, to meet this plan would require \$550,000 in offerings.

We started the year well, and the holiday seasons (Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas) historically bring an influx of attendance and giving. However, during the summer months, we have historically dealt with a decline in attendance and offerings which results in an increased monthly operating deficit. Even as offerings decline during this time of the year, operating expenses and ministry continue. One way to even out your giving, if you are gone during the summer (or other times) is to utilize Simply Giving®.

Stewardship. Behind the scenes is a group of persons working each year to grow and develop the principles of good stewardship at Trinity. At first blush, you may think this is an article about money. It is not.

The theme for 2015 is 'Followers of Christ'. You may have noticed that each week, a blurb is printed in the bulletin giving a key reminder of the need to be engaged in the process of ministry at Trinity. Most times this blurb makes reference to one of the scripture readings of the day. Also, each week, through articles, prayer, preaching and by example, your church leaders are committed to demonstrating good stewardship principles. Good stewards seek excellence in all they do and say. It is not enough to go about the usual maintenance of our building and premises and be about the customary nurturing of our membership. We must be about the growth of our church, not just in numbers of souls to be saved, but about completing the assigned mission of our church, which is to bring all people into a personal relationship with their Lord.

The first goal is to be good at what we do. Complacency is the mother of all disasters and we cannot simply shrug our shoulders and opine that the world doesn't need to hear God's Word or be concerned with saving souls. How can we not be inspired to serve when we have been given so very much. We all know that "to whom much is given, much more is required". It is a necessary reminder. But many of you are struggling right now with constraints on your time, limitations on the use of your talents to serve, and we must ask ourselves relevant questions? "What amount of time have I set aside to worship? What amount of time have I set aside to study God's Word? How have I used my God given talents to God's glory, and not my own?"

We recognize these are hard questions. The encouragement comes from faithful attendance at worship, renewed interest in Bible study and resolve to commit the time required to seek excellence to God's glory. It does not matter that God has showered you with citizenship in the greatest, wealthiest country in the world. It matters what we do with our gifts. There is no doubt that everyone has heard, been taught and understands the words: Return to God a portion of your talents, treasures and time".....but the hardest of these is time. Hard-working industrious people are we. We can educate and train our minds, become skillful at what we do. Yet we are hesitant, almost blushing, if we are asked to do something new at church. Here lies the problem: Good stewards should not need to be asked, but rather, the good steward asks "What can I do?"

August is a time of preparation for the fall education schedule at Trinity. Consider all that Trinity offers. Be mindful of your obligation to be a good steward of your time. Don't wait to be asked to volunteer. Seek out what needs to be done. There is no academy award for initiative. There is no news outlet ready to recognize you for your efforts. No trophies, notoriety or fame. Only the satisfaction of knowing a good steward puts his faith in action. God won't ask us how big our home on earth was; He likely will ask us how many people we invited to our church home. Ready? Set! Go!
