My Most Dear and Precious Family and Friends

Then pray regarding yourself to seek the possibility of using your God-given gifts to join with those already serving.





Task Force News

Your Taskforce has met frequently, usually once a week, and researched issues at Trinity for the past six months. Much of this work has been driven by your responses to the questions Pastor Griffin presented during the Cottage Meetings. As we move into our seventh month the research, interviews, questions, and studies of the issues has come to a close. We have now begun the task of forming recommendations to address those issues we have found over the past six months.

You are aware of some of the changes the Communication Group have proposed or implemented. One of the many that is being work on now is the "One Call Now" system that will allow Trinity to contact you by the method you would prefer to be notified in the event of last minute schedule changes (such as weather cancellations) or other events here at Trinity. Please let Katy know of your choice(s).

The Leadership Group has been looking at several areas of our current structure that have impacted the ministry here at Trinity. Among those studied they have identified problems or issues in our current Mission Statements and our Bylaws.

The Communication Group agreed to look into and work with the Vision/Mission Statements. They have met with Leland and Cynthia to discuss the issues the Taskforce has identified. It was agreed these statements need to be revisited and will be addressed at the CLC retreat the end of September.

The Taskforce met with the Lay Ministers to review and discuss our proposed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws. There are some minor corrections and clarifications needed to the Constitution, but due to the involved and lengthy process of making those changes, the Constitution can wait for a more opportune time.

The Bylaw changes, however, are more in-depth and will require study on the part of the CLC, but the change procedure is not nearly as involved. So it is our hope these can be brought before the Voters to consider at the regular semi-annual meeting in January 2016.

Additionally, the Taskforce has begun working with the Call Committee to help assemble a congregational survey to consider your desires for Trinity's pastoral needs. We also will help them formulate a job description to attach to the call document.

Although our tasks are slowly winding down, there is still a lot of work to be done. We will continue to help and assist in whatever capacity we can to further the Ministry of Christ here at Trinity and in the World. We continue to ask you to pray for God's guidance of your Taskforce.

At the January Voters' Meeting, a budget – ministry spending plan – was adopted in the amount of \$577,195. If all budgeted items were fully spent, to meet this plan would require \$550,000 in offerings.

We started the year well, and the holiday seasons (Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas) historically bring an influx of attendance and giving. However, during the summer months, we have historically dealt with a decline in attendance and offerings, which results in an increased monthly operating deficit. Even as offerings decline during this time of the year, operating expenses and ministry continue. One way to even out your giving is to utilize Simply Giving®. 

A Note from our Congregational President, Jay Meyer:

In an effort to communicate better, the Church Leadership Council asked that I share some information with the entire congregation.

As you are all aware, Pastor Griffin recently accepted a call to Faith Lutheran, Lake Forest, IL. When Pastor Griffin accepted our call last year as our Intentional Interim Pastor we agreed to a 12 month contract, with the understanding that his tenure here could be shorter or longer depending on a number of factors. One of the negotiated benefits of that contract was our agreement to pay Pastor Griffin for a 13th month that he intended for rest and recharge at his home prior to beginning his next call, wherever that may be. When he recently felt the Lord calling him to another congregation, effectively ending his tenure at Trinity after only 9 months, it became necessary to negotiate a settlement of this "extra time". In our final meeting with Pastor Griffin before his departure, the Lay Ministers and he mutually agreed that a pro-rated period of 3 weeks would be a fair settlement of this extra paid time off.

Therefore, Pastor Griffin, whose last official day with Trinity was September 13th, will be paid through October 3rd. If you have any questions regarding this issue please don't hesitate to contact me or one of the other Lay Ministers. Thank you.


