

August 2015 Taskforce Newsletter

The Taskforce has had very busy months since our last newsletter update in July. In April we decided to form two committees to look into areas we felt need to be addressed carefully. They are the Communication Committee and the Leadership Committee. Following are report comments from each.

Leadership: Following are our activities for the months of July and August: the Leadership subcommittee spent considerable time interviewing stakeholders in the congregation at several levels. The results of the interviews were compiled into a comprehensive directional statement that would guide us through recommendations to update Trinity's Constitution and By-laws. These recommended changes would be intended to improve the operational flow of the staff and leadership for Trinity Lutheran Church. Moving forward, we are planning to work proactively with the Lay Ministers and CLC to bring these recommendations to the Congregation for approval. Committee members are Jared Froetschner, Tom Hogan, and Aaron Miller.

Communication: The Communications Group of the Task Force continues to work on enhancing communication through the areas identified in the cottage meetings. We are working on a lot of projects; we want to highlight a big project that could impact the majority of our congregation: "One Call Now" is a system that allows calling and notification through voice, text, email, and social media. The system is designed to inspire, protect, inform and engage our congregation through the technology you prefer. At the January Voters' Meeting, a budget – ministry spending plan – was adopted in the amount of \$577,195. If all budgeted items were fully spent, to meet this plan would require \$550,000 in offerings.

We started the year well, and the holiday seasons (Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas) historically bring an influx of attendance and giving. However, during the summer months, we have historically dealt with a decline in attendance and offerings which results in an increased monthly operating deficit. Even as offerings decline during this time of the year, operating expenses and ministry continue. One way to even out your giving is to utilize Simply Giving®. PieceMakers had a wonderful summer, as you could tell by the Quilt Blessing done in Worship. We are amazed at how God continues to provide for our needs.

On August 5 we delivered quilts to Homestead Nursing Care on 3rd Street. Amber, the activities director, introduced us to every resident who was to receive a quilt. She gave this quilt delivery a very personal touch. Tears of joy were shed as we watched students share their quilt and their heart with these residents. A few days after our delivery, an employee of Homestead called the church and explained that she had fabric to donate to our ministry. Five large totes of fabric and thread were given to PieceMakers. Amazing! We were running low on thread. We are reminded of Ephesians 3:20, "God is able to do immeasurably more than we can ask or imagine".

Thank you those who assisted with PieceMakers this summer, and a BIG thank you to those who are building the room in the basement to house the Long Arm. We are learning that you cannot 'outgive' God.


