Christ's Love Compels Us

"For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, therefore all died. And He died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for Him Who died for them and was raised again"

(2 Corinthians 5:14-15).

Some sons disobey their fathers. Others obey unwillingly with arguing and complaining, resentful of their fathers' authority. Still others are compliant, but are there any who would be as submissive as Jesus was to His Father's will? ". . . yet not My will, but Yours be done," Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:42). Carrying out His Father's will was no easy task. But, because His love for us is as great as the Father's, Jesus was willing to win our salvation for us by carrying out the plan the Triune God had established before the foundations of the world were laid. It was His love for us that caused Christ to give His very life so that we, who were dead in sin, might be alive forevermore in Him.

There is nothing we can do to earn this love; there is nothing we can do to "pay Him back." The Christian life of stewardship is a response to His love. His love compels us to respond by loving Him first and best and loving others as ourselves. His love compels us to provide for our pastors, teachers, and missionaries who work to bring the Gospel to the world for which He died (1 Corinthians 9:9-12). His love compels us to look after the widow and the orphan (James 1:27). His love compels us to feed the hungry, extend hospitality to the homeless, clothe the destitute, and visit the prisoner (Matthew 25:37-40).

Stewardship is the use of life and all of life's resources, in response to the grace of God in our lives, poured out in service to others, even as Christ poured out His lifeblood for us. The prophet Micah clarifies to us what God requires of us: "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8b). These are not attitudes we can work up of our own accord. Only as we are renewed daily through Word and Sacrament can we respond to this great love of Christ and respond in joyful service and generous giving that pleases God.

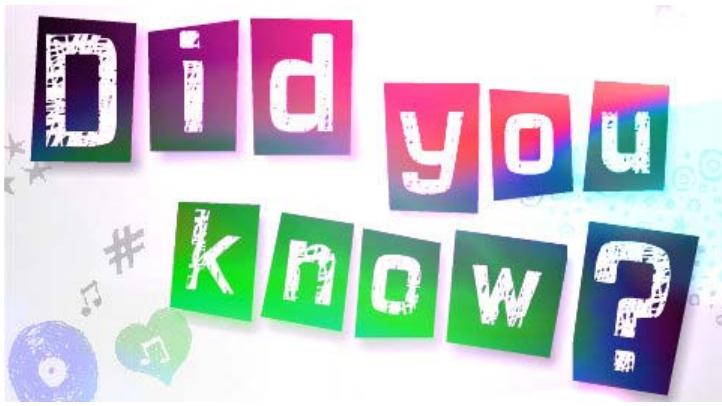

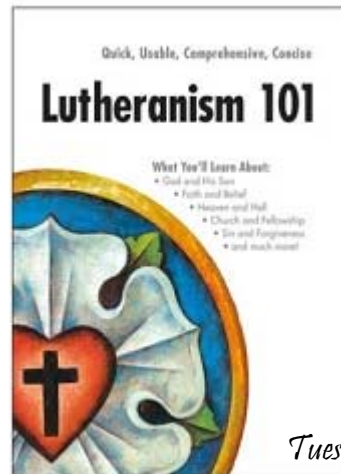

In the past, all congregations have been invited to support Kansas District missions and ministry through the annual Ash Wednesday offering. The Kansas District Board of Directors designated the 2016 Ash Wednesday offering to be divided equally between the Scholarship and Education Loan Repayment Funds.

The Scholarship Fund supports students pursuing a career in professional church work at an LCMS university or seminary. Over \$42,000 was distributed to 24 students in 2015, with amounts varying from \$1,000 for freshmen to \$2,820 for seminary students. We want to encourage more of our members to become church workers, but the high cost of education can be overwhelming. The average cost of tuition only at a Concordia University is about \$25,000. School scholarships may possibly cut that figure in half. Adding books and room and board leaves students with a significant amount to finance.

The Education Loan Repayment Fund supports professional church workers who carry indebtedness from their college and seminary education. In 2015, a total of \$26,100 was awarded to 29 workers, with grants sent directly to the lender. These workers reported loans totaling over \$978,000.

Of the pastors, the average education loan debt was \$36,800 (ranging from \$5,600 to \$96,000); of the teachers - \$28,100 (\$2,900 to \$52,000); of the DCEs - \$23,800 (\$3,600 to \$57,600).

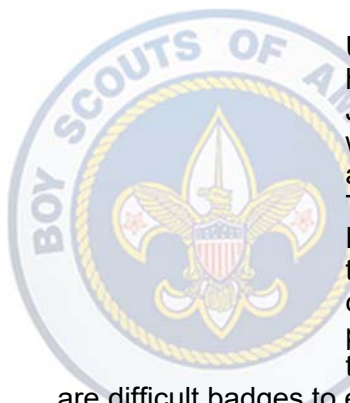
