

The Committee has a list of favorites songs that members have given through two different surveys over the years, and we take that into consideration during worship planning. For over 15 years, Creative Worship has been the foundation for the service and LSB Setting III is frequently used for our Communion services. The 5th Sunday of a month has been designated as a youth Sunday and has been an opportunity for our youth to help lead in song, skit and readings.

It's not easy to plan a service that will touch the lives of all ages, but each service points to the Savior. A definition for worship is "work". We, the committee, plan the service to be meaningful for the worshipers who "work" at giving praise and thanksgiving for all that Jesus has done, and is doing, through the cross and the empty tomb.

Let us all together encourage one another as we worship our Lord.

In September 2015, Trinity hosted a Leadership Retreat led by Pastor Darrell Zimmerman of Grace Place. One of the ideas that came from that retreat was the value of getting to know one another better. This month, Tim Lavrenz, Trinity's custodian, shares:

I was born in 1959, the fifth of seven children to Ray and Velma Lavrenz. My father was a part time minister/ full time lumberyard manager. My mother was a stay at home mom, whose full time job was keeping us in line.

The first five years of my life was spent living in a small American town, complete with hand pump and outhouse. We then moved to another small town that came complete with indoor plumbing. We lived there until 1969, when we moved to yet another small (albeit larger than the previous two) town where my parents spent the remainders of their lives. It was here that I met my yet unknown to everyone but the Lord, wife Cynthia.

Upon graduating in 1977, I began working in a factory that produced living room sofas, hog confinements, and blow mold plastic bottles. Yes, all one factory.

In 1981 I started work in a hog packing plant where I stayed until they closed the doors.

In 1984 I started dating my (yet still unknown to me) wife Cynthia.

Having been raised Lutheran, church was common around our house. My father had started out to become a fully ordained minister, but war brought an end to that idea. He spent the rest of his life filling in for churches who were without pastors due to vacancies, and vacations. When he wasn't doing that, he worked as a manager in the Co-op lumberyards

My mother started playing organ in high school, and upon graduation began playing for our hometown church. She played as organist for the next sixty some years. My oldest brother became a fully ordained minister about 25 years ago. It is his sermons that you've heard me preach while filling in.

My wife and I started dating in 1984 and were married the next year. It only took a couple weeks of watching how much she enjoyed the work she did in our church to finally realize this is who I wanted to spend the rest of my life with. God's patient hand had been steering me along this path for quite a few years. It was only after I let go and let God that I came to this realization. We are now starting our 32nd year together.

My main interests and hobbies are oil painting, fishing, hunting, card playing, and raising our boys.

The fiscal health of ABC is improving. In December, we were looking at possibly closing the doors, but God has made it very apparent to us that our work is not done. He has been opening doors for us and we feel excited at what He has in store for ABC in the year 2016.

Finances over the years have been a constant struggle. We are solely funded by churches and individuals and do not receive any grants or government funding. This past year, we had a total of 185 donors, 14 of those donor support our satellite office in Ulysses, Precious Beginnings. Of the remaining 171 donors, 112 were one time donors, leaving us with 59 donors who are repeat givers.







Jay Meyer called the meeting to order. DCE Cynthia Lavrenz shared the 40 Days Grace Place Day 6 devotion based on Ephesians 4:6

CONSENSUS APPROVAL ITEMS: Minutes of the 12/17/15 and 1/21/16 meetings were presented. Jared Froetschner moved the minutes be accepted and Mike Reagle seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

REPORTS:

- Questions to and/or Comments from Staff: Discussion of DCE Leland Jackson's report was focused on the need for storage for mowers and vehicles and the suggestions presented by Leland. Jared Froestchner moved that we set aside \$300.00 per month towards the cost of storage and cleanup of the back lot until we can put together a long plan for that area. Discussion followed. Motion died for the lack of a second. Mike Reagle moved that DCE Leland Jackson work with the Long Range Planning Committee on the plans for the proposed shed and that the Long Range Planning Committee presents CLC with a proposal before any other action is taken. Buddy Skeie seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote. DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that Youth Quake was a wonderful event and that she is starting Chaplain Clinical Professional Education training. She and Tim will be attending a Shephard's Canyon retreat at the end of March. The money has been gifted for the Chaplain CPE training and the retreat. Cynthia also reported that the Stephen Ministers are extremely busy and there is a need for more so she and Tammy Lampe will be starting a new training session soon. The Planting Seeds of Faith committee is working on Mission Statement classes and an Outreach project. VBS planning is under wav.
- Lay Ministry: Jay Meyer reported that all services are covered through Easter. Called Staff evaluations are under way. Jay also reported that the ABCD Board are still working on their signage project and will him know when they are ready to present their proposal to CLC.
- **Properties Committee:** Martin Nusser reported that the ad hoc committee for the outdoor sign is still working but not ready to make a recommendation yet. He also reported that Tim Lavrenz has stated a need for a new mower and that he will work on obtaining bids. Buddy Skeie reported that all the Exit Signs have had bulbs installed and are now working. He is recommending that Trinity switch to Pryor for the fire sprinkler inspection and work. Approval was given by CLC. He also reported that the State Inspectors for the Preschool said that the water temperature does not met state regulations as it could possibly scald someone. Five new faucets with thermostats have been ordered and will be installed to resolve this issue.
- Long Range Planning Committee: Buddy Skeie reported that R J Plumbing will install the drains for the showers in the basement tomorrow and after that is done the new floor will be poured. Showers will be in next week. He stated that several volunteers have been involved in the installation of the walls, sheet rocking, texturing and painting and that good progress is being made.
- **Call Committee:** Jay Meyer reported the Pastoral Candidate List has been received. There are 14 candidates including 5 submitted from Trinity members. The list will be published in the newsletter and the congregation can share any comments and objections that they have regarding any candidate with Jay Meyer. The committee met Monday with Pastor Wehling to review the procedures. The committee will meet next week to begin discussion on the candidates.

OLD BUSINESS:

It was determined that there was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

LERT Trailer: The staff is requesting permission to apply for a grant to purchase a LERT (Lutheran Early Response Team) Trailer. Discussion followed regarding: Contents, Value of Trailer, Committee in Charge of Use, Associated Costs (insurance, repairs, replacement), Guidelines for Usage, etc. CLC requested information regarding these items be E Mailed to the CLC members prior to the next meeting so that a decision can be made at that time. Next Meeting Date: The CLC meeting will be Thursday, March 17th at 6:30 p.m.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Katy Pauley reminded everyone that she needs a count by February 22nd for those attending Meet the Staff on Saturday, February 27th at Dodge City.

Jared Froestchner moved that the meeting be adjourned. Jerry Bitter seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote. Meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
