Dear Friends,

I truly love the excitement and joy as we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Savior! During Advent we have a meal in the Fellowship Hall starting at 5:45. We follow this with Worship at 6:30; and then we will have Bible Studies for all ages, as our younger children prepare for the Christmas Service. They will share this with the congregation on December 18). Please read on to hear about our services for Advent.

This year our Midweek Advent services are titled *Call of Christmas*. It is more than just the story of Jesus' arrival. Each week we will hear from someone special that was involved in preparation for the arrival of Jesus. A time of worship in the temple turns to a life-altering event for Zechariah. We will watch what happens when the angel, Gabriel, pays him a visit and he's **called to prepare**. It's the beginning of a story that changes the lives of every person who hears it.

Next we will see Mary when she was visited by the angel and found herself in God's favor and overcome with so many emotions. We will see how Mary responds to the words of the angel—, as she is **called to prepare**, words that changed everything.

Who would've thought that a dream could be reality? We will see Joseph discover the role he will play in the story of Emmanuel when an angel visits him in a dream with a **call to protect**. The Messiah is coming and Joseph gets to be part of this story—a story that is now a part of us.

Nobody would expect lowly shepherds to be some of the first to hear about the birth of the Messiah. But God's angel comes to these men with good news, calling them to praise. They're invited to be part of the story, reminding us that God calls us all to Himself.

Finally, on Christmas morning we reflect on the stories of Zechariah, Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds before we are introduced to the Christ child who would change the world forever. We too are reminded that we have each been given a call to prepare, a call to provide, a call to protect, and a call to praise.

We have 3 Wednesday night services plus the wondrous joy of celebrating Christmas Eve and Christmas day.

Our children's' service this year is *To Us a Child Is Born*, believers of all ages gather to sing songs that have been sung for generations in celebration of our Savior's birth. But along with those traditional hymns, each new generation adds to the Church's praise of the Lord, creating a rich heritage of hymnody throughout the ages.

To Us a Child Is Born celebrates favorite hymns that are hundreds—some almost thousands—of years old, and a new song for Christmas, "To Us a Child Is Born". The central theme for this Christmas program, the words of Isaiah 9, help us reflect on the promise God the Father fulfilled through the birth of His Son, a gift to us, that we may become the children of God. Many words of thanks to our volunteers and teachers that make this Christmas service one to remember.

So, my church family, as we head into a new church season may we continue to thank God for all He does for us daily. May we take time daily to use our Advent devotions, *Portal of Prayers*, and of course our Bible. Instead of getting caught in all the busyness let's get busy using our Bibles and allow our Savior to care for the stuff we just can't wrap our heads around. Merry Christmas my dear Trinity Family.

God continues to bless the PieceMaker ministry at the Juvenile Detention Center. To date, the students have made 360 quilts. This ministry started as a prompting from the Holy Spirit: "Who tells these kids that they have value and worth"? And nearly 4 years later, every Thursday, the students at the JDC hear that Jesus loves them. The JDC volunteers are privileged to share the Gospel, give a high five, speak an encouraging word and teach a skill; all as we sew and tie auilts.

The population at the JDC changes from week to week, although some students are there for an extended period. It is safe to say that over 500 students have been shown the love of Jesus since this ministry began. And not only do we share the love of Jesus with the students, but we have also built friendships with the evening guards. Just last week a guard stated how much they appreciate the quilting ministry.

The students feel good about making something useful for another person and often choose the recipients. Over the years, the quilts have been donated to Nursing Homes, ABC Pregnancy Care Center, Foster Children, St Catherine's Hospital, Emmaus House, Old Soldier's Home, Mexico Missions, and auctioned off to raise money.

Thank you to those who have cut fabric squares, sewn on backs, volunteered, donated money toward, and prayed for the mission and ministry of the PieceMakers JDC. Please continue to keep this ministry in your prayers. Ask God to empower us, through the Holy Spirit, to compassionately share the love of Jesus with these students.



Offerings—there are as many types as there are ways to give them. Still, regardless of what we give and when, it's hard to present a true offering without being vulnerable to rejection. From meals we offer our families to romantic serenades to the word on tis page, it can be nerve-racking to give others the power to judge our gifts. Questions like "Are we giving enough?" and "Are we good enough?" fill our minds. Instead the focus should be on "How can I continue to show love because of the gifts God gives me?"

When our invulnerable God offered Himself as our substitute, He became a fragile, vulnerable baby. As a man, when Christ offered Himself for our sons, He face rejection and scorn. No one forced him to do this. We may think of offerings as something we have to give, rather than something we are allowed to give. But that has never been God's way. Christ died on the cross in our place not because He had to but because He wanted to.

He offers us faith, hope, and life because He wants us to have them, and they are exactly what we need. What fools we would be not to accept such and offer!

God, lead us to eagerly receive the gifts Your Son has earned. Amen.
