Keeping Score?

We Americans are a competitive bunch. We love to keep score. Your team vs. my team. Your grades vs. my grades. Your salary vs. my salary. We might be polite enough not to say it out loud, but inside we're all keeping score one way or the other.

What would happen if God kept score? If God kept a running total of every deed you ever did, good and bad, how would you fare? Every good deed would count in your favor. Every sin would count against you. Would you be ahead right now, or behind? Would you win in the end or would you lose? Most of us like to believe that if God were keeping score, we'd be on the plus side. We like to think that, overall, we're doing more good than evil. We assure ourselves that even if my score isn't as high as I'd like it to be, I can point to plenty of people whose scores are lower than mine.

But the truth is, if God were keeping score, we'd all be in trouble. Every one of us. Psalm 130 says "Lord, if you kept a record of our sins, who could ever survive?" The psalmist is convinced that if God kept score, none of us would come out ahead. Because God sees everything --- not just what's on the outside, but also what's in our hearts. God sees that we are sinners in thought, word, and deed, and we fall far short of the perfection He demands. And even the good things we do are often done for selfish motives, for selfish gain. The truth is, if God were keeping score, we'd lose, and lose big!

But Psalm 130 continues: "Lord, if you kept a record of our sins, who could ever survive? But you offer forgiveness, that we might learn to fear you." That is the great, wonderful message of salvation that Jesus came to share. We're way behind on the score, but God wipes the scorecard clean. God forgives. God is a merciful God who does not hold our sins against us.

Sounds simple, doesn't it? God just forgives my sin — no problem, right? Not quite. Forgiveness is a word that slips off the tongue too easily among us, as if it costs nothing. In fact, 'forgiveness' is the hardest, most expensive word on the planet. That word, 'forgiveness,' cost Jesus Christ, the Son of God, His life. That word sent Him down to earth to be mocked and killed for you. When Jesus cried out from the cross, "It is finished," He paid the price for that word, forgiveness. He was abandoned and stricken by God, so that you would never face that great pain and suffering that He endured. It is in His death that we have God's forgiveness. Confess your sins, and God will nail them to the cross.

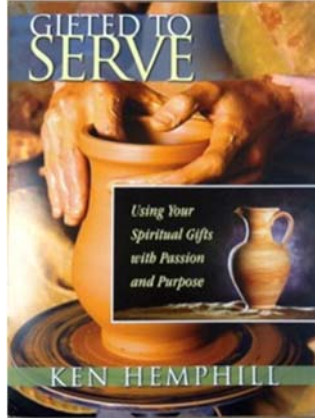

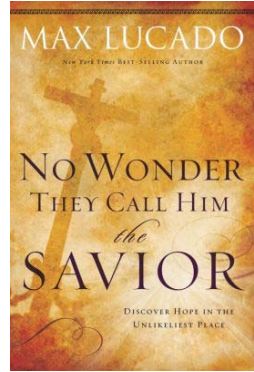

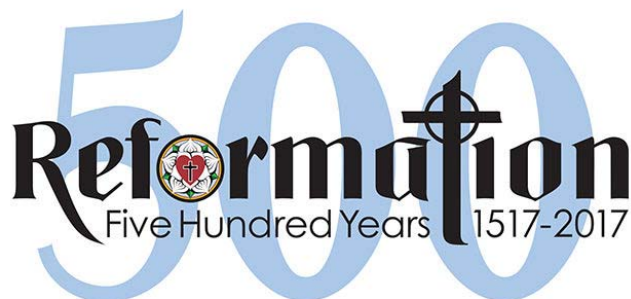
