

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH – CHURCH LEADERSHIP COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE MEETING 11/20/2014 6:30 p.m.

PRESENT: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz, Martin Nusser, Lisa Hogan, Ron Hall, Heidi Berg, DCE Leland Jackson, Buddy Skeie,

Buddy Skeie called the meeting to order. The opening devotion and prayer on Stewardship of Self was presented by DCE Cynthia Lavrenz.

DCE Leland Jackson introduced Alan Watson, Larry Unsworth, Jared Froetschner, and Wendy Dunagan who gave a presentation on the Venture Crew. The Venture Crew is a youth development program of the Boy Scouts of America and is for boys and girls. They are looking for a Charter Partner. Some of the responsibilities of the Charter Partner include a place to meet, a Charter Organization Representative and possible seed money. They would like to start the crew up by summer. They are asking Trinity to consider being the Charter Partner as they feel it would work well with and enhance TLC's current youth program.

CONSENSUS APPROVAL ITEMS: Minutes of the 10/16/14 meeting was presented. Marty Nusser moved the minutes be approved and Mike Reagle seconded the motion. Motion passed by voice vote.

REPORTS:

Staff: DCE Leland Jackson reported that the Matthew 25 grant is at \$9,000.00 and that the additional funds came from the Chamber as he was the keynote speaker at this month's Chamber Breakfast. There are possibly 41 going to Mexico. He also stated that he and the Senior High group visited the Trinity members at Garden Valley. They sang for them and gave them cinnamon rolls. DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that there will be 26 booths at Saturday's bazaar.

Website: Buddy Skeie reported that work is progressing and there is \$400.00 of the designated amount remaining. He also stated that Katy Pauley is to be trained on updating the website. Lisa Hogan reported that the website is unavailable right now but can be previewed at karlpeschel.com/tlc. She also asked the staff to make sure that they reviewed the website and communicate to Karl any changes and corrections.

Narthex Remodel: Buddy Skeie reported that there are additional plumbing issues but with R J Plumbing's help they are being resolved and when everything is done all bathrooms will be working including the one in the vestry. He also stated that a gift has been received to replace all the existing carpet in the hallways. Dedication will be on Sunday, December 7th with a reception afterwards. Diann Stone is heading up the plans for the reception.

OLD BUSINESS:

Intentional Interim Pastor: Ron Hall reported that Trinity's call to Rev. Timm Griffin has been issued and he has stated that he will have an answer to us by November 24th.

NEW BUSINESS:

Crisis Management Plan: DCE Cynthia Lavrenz reported that she and Katy Pauley have had a preliminary meeting with the Police Department. Mike Reagle reported that the staff, CLC, Preschool Teachers and the ABCD Board will need to complete a 2 hour crisis training to be conducted by the Police Department and that this needs to be done prior to the completion of the Crisis Management Plan. It was the consensus of CLC to proceed with this training. Mike Reagle will provide DCE Cynthia Lavrenz with some dates that the Police Department will be available to do the training.

Elevator Repair: DCE Leland Jackson reported that due to a transition in service people at Kone the necessary upkeep to the elevator has not been done for about 3 years and that the hydraulic packing needs to be replaced at a cost of \$4,240.00. Kone requires 50% payment up front. He also reported that there are a couple of other items that need to be taken care of and if they are done at the same time it will save us about \$500.00. He also stated that by having the hydraulic packing replaced that Kone will waive the annual \$350.00 safety test fee. (See attached E Mail). Discussion followed. The consensus of CLC is that the elevator be posted as out of order until maintenance is completed. Mike Reagle moved that all necessary repairs to the elevator be completed. Lisa Hogan seconded and motion passed by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report and 2015 Ministry Plan/Budget: Treasurer's report through October 31, 2014 was handed out by Katy Pauley (see attached). Jay Meyer reported that the Lay Ministers have visited with Loretta Schultz about the need for a review of the accounting records which she agreed to assist with. They also requested that she consider training someone as her back up. Mike Reagle moved that a review of the accounting records be conducted by three (3) independent parties to cover 2013 and the first 3 quarters of 2014 and that it be completed by the next Voters' Meeting. Martin Nusser seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote. It was decided that the Congregational Informational Meeting will be at 1:00 p.m. on January 18, 2015 and the Voters' Meeting will be on January 25, 2015 at 1:00 p.m.

Lay Delegate for District Convention: The Kansas District Convention will be June 4th-6th. For voting purposes Trinity is entitled to one Lay Delegate and one Ministerial Delegate, so since the nominations are due by November 30th and we are in vacancy one Lay Delegate is all that we can nominate. Jay Meyer reported that Rick Beltz has volunteered to be the Lay Delegate. Martin Nusser moved that Rick Beltz represent Trinity at the 2015 District Convention as our Lay Delegate. Lisa Hogan seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Jay Meyer announced that Suzanne Hewes will retire as Trinity's Preschool Director/Teacher at the end of the school year.

The next meeting is December 18, 2014 at 6:30 p.m.

Jay Meyer adjourned the meeting and closed with The Doxology.

will host an Eagle Scout Court of Honor for
Scott Dunagan
February 1, 2015, 2:00 p.m., at Trinity Lutheran
Church in Garden City at

Scoutmaster Eric Relph and Assistant Scoutmaster Josh Messenger will be conducting the ceremony and a reception will follow. Troop 109 is chartered with the Nazarene Church of Garden City.

Eagle Scout Scott Dunagan, 15, is a sophomore at Holcomb High School and a member of Trinity Lutheran Church. He is the son of Travis and Wendy Dunagan of Holcomb, Kansas. Scott is also a member of the Order of the Arrow, the National Honor Society for Boy Scouts. He attended the 2013 National Jamboree in Washington DC and the Summit Bechtel Scout Ranch in West Virginia. Scott also worked at the Spanish Peaks Scout Ranch in Colorado last summer as a camp counselor-in-training. Spanish Peaks Scout Ranch is owned by the Santa Fe Trail Council based in Garden City, Kansas. Scott participated in two evacuations due to flash flooding last summer. Scott has served as assistant patrol leader and patrol leader within Troop 109.

Two entities benefitted from Scott's Eagle project: the William Wilson Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution of Garden City and Ingalls Township. Scott worked with DAR Regent Carley Hazelton in mapping the Ingalls Cemetery, as the records were lost many years ago. They located thirty-two unmarked graves. The DAR supplied Scott with white crosses and Scott and members of Troop 109 anchored the crosses on the graves. Scott also worked with Don Redger who is a member of the Ingalls Cemetery Board. He asked Mr. Redger what improvements he would like have done to the grounds. They agreed upon the construction of a gazebo. Scott had enough money left over to re-side, re-paint and re-shingle the caretaker's shed. Scott was able to raise the funds for this project through charitable donations of businesses in Cimarron, Dodge City, Scott City and Garden City. A large portion of the funding

came from the people he has sold popcorn to over the years. He has sold over \$15,000 worth of Trails End Popcorn since third grade. He approached his popcorn customers and explained what he was doing for his Eagle project. Many of his customers have watched Scott grow up over the years and were very willing to donate to his project.

To earn the rank of Eagle Scout, a boy must earn at least twenty-one merit badges; serve his troop in a variety of leadership roles; and complete a major service project. Only 4% of scouts ever achieve the Eagle Scout rank. In all, Scott has earned a total of forty-three merit badges. One of his most memorable merit badges was taught at the Kansas Cosmosphere by one of the engineers who worked on Apollo 13. Scott's Eagle project totaled 311.5 working hours not including time for fundraising. The total working hours is a total of all volunteers' recorded times spent on the project. Scott personally logged 58 hours not including time spent fundraising. All work time was tracked by sign in sheets.


