

In September 2015, Trinity hosted a Leadership Retreat led by Pastor Darrell Zimmerman of Grace Place. One of the ideas that came from that retreat was the value of getting to know one another better.

This month, Jay Meyer, congregational president, shares:

I was born in 1962 and raised on a farm south of Linn, KS in rural Washington County. My dad raised dryland wheat and milo, but our primary enterprise was a fairly large purebred hog operation; dad sold breeding stock to other swine operations in Kansas and neighboring states. My dad's parents lived just a half mile away on the old Meyer farmstead. Grandpa was very involved in the farming operation and had a small cow herd of his own. My Grandma Sophie raised chickens and helped feed the cattle, along with all the other duties farm wives were expected to perform in those days. My dad's parents were the pillars of our Christian family. Their home was also the gathering place for their children (4 girls & 2 boys), along with their families (our cousins), around the holidays and during the summers. It was nice not having to travel much during the holidays!

My mom was a city girl from Nebraska, the daughter of a Lutheran pastor, Rev. E.F. Frese. Grandpa Frese served several congregations in Nebraska during his lifetime. I believe they were in Beatrice, NE when my parents met. They met at a Walther League church camp in south-central Nebraska (my mom jokes about her dad "forcing" her to go hang out with a bunch of redneck farm boys from Kansas!) It must've been true love because they eventually would marry and dad somehow convinced mom to move to the farm. They raised 3 children on that farm (I have a younger brother and sister); it was a good life and we learned the value of hard work.

My home church, St. John's Lutheran, was just two miles away from our home. We also had a small, tworoom parochial school there (grades 1 through 8). I place great value on the Christian education I received there, but even more important than that was the great example we had from our parents, grandparents and our entire Lutheran community. worship and were very involved in all church-related activities. These are values I didn't fully appreciate until I had a family of my own. I went to high school in Linn and college at Kansas State, graduating with a BS in Ag Economics. My first job was in Colby, KS with the Federal Land Bank. After one year in Colby I decided to move to Garden City and worked for the Federal Land Bank here (later known as Farm Credit Services). Liz and I met a few months later and after dating for a couple of years we were married here at Trinity by Rev. Oestmann in 1989. A couple years later, in December, 1991, we moved to Sublette where I began work for the Haskell County State Bank (now known as Centera Bank), and have called this our home ever since. We have 2 grown daughters, Hannah and Emily, who both graduated from Kansas State as well. Hannah has a 6 year old daughter (our granddaughter), Lily. She keeps our life interesting and has just been a wonderful blessing from God. As we look back and reflect on our lives thus far, Liz and I can definitely see God's hand in so many ways. Though there have been many trials and heartaches along the way, He has always been there beside us and we have just been so blessed. Thanks be to Him!





#### TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH – VOTERS' MEETING MINUTES OF THE MEETING JANUARY 24, 2016, 1:00 p.m.

Thirty-eight people signed the attendance roster.

Jay Meyer called the meeting to order and opened with a devotion entitled "Our Debts are Paid" based on Romans 4:25, followed by prayer.

Minutes from the June 28, 2015 Voters' meeting was presented. Gerry Schultz moved and Jared Froetschner seconded that the minutes be approved. The motion passed by voice vote.

Loretta Schultz presented the following financial information as of December 31, 2015:

Offerings:	\$511,301
Expenses:	(\$542,097)
2015 Deficit:	(\$ 30,796)
Surplus:	<b>`</b> \$106,291

She also reported that as of December 31, 2015 the balance of the Narthex Remodel was \$40,472 but as of today the balance is \$0.00. The Doxology was sung in Praise and Thanksgiving to God.

Jay Meyer reported that the Financial Review Committee completed their review of 2013 and 2014. They submitted recommendations to the Church Leadership Council (CLC). Recommendations were addressed by the CLC with the majority of the recommendations being implemented.

The Call Committee report was presented by Jay Meyer. He stated that the Congregational Self-Study was given to Pastor Lange when he visited in December. Jay read a Thank You from Pastor Lange for his visit. Jay went on to state that the Congregational nominations had been received the first week of January and the committee is currently waiting on the list of candidates from District.

There was no old business to be acted upon. The floor was opened for new business.

Jay Meyer reported that the Church Leadership Council (CLC) received a list of organizations from the Ad Hoc Mission Committee to consider for the 2015 Additional Tithe. The amount is \$8,865. CLC is recommending the following: 1/3 (\$2,955) each to: Lead A Child, Orphan Grain Train, and Lutheran World Relief. Bob Drees moved to accept the Church Leadership Council's recommendation for expenditure of the 2015 Additional Tithe amount. Motion was seconded by Jerry Bitter and passed by voice vote.

Jay Meyer reported that the Church Leadership Council voted to disburse the 2015 Royalty Income of \$9,436 as follows:

LCMS Disaster Relief Fund - \$2,436, Lutheran Valley Retreat - \$1,400, Concordia Seward - \$1,400, Kindle - \$1,400, Lighted Path - \$1,400 and Haskell Lighthouse - \$1,400. CLC issued a challenge to the congregation to try and match the amount for LCMS Disaster Relief Fund. Gerry Schultz moved to ratify the Church Leadership Council vote, Paul Pauley seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote. Jerry Bitter moved that CLC determine the disbursement of the 2016 Royalty Income in December, 2016. Paul Pauley seconded the motion. Jay Meyer gave a history of the Royalty Income. Discussion followed and mission ideas were shared. Motion passed by a voice vote.

Loretta Schultz presented the 2016 Ministry Plan/Budget in the amount of \$497,500 (see attached). Jay Meyer stated that this amount included cost of living wage increases for the current staff and a pastor salary for 6 months based on a minimum of 10 years of experience. Discussion followed. Gerry Schultz moved that the 2016 Ministry Plan/Budget for \$497,500 be accepted. Chuck Messenger seconded the motion and it passed by voice vote.

Jay Meyer reported that CLC recommends increasing the Janitorial position hours from 25 to 30. Loretta Schultz presented a revised 2016 Ministry Plan/Budget reflecting this recommendation, which increases the amount to \$500,000 (see attached). Discussion followed. Martin Nusser moved to amend the above approved motion to read \$500,000. Mike Reagle seconded the amended motion and it passed by voice vote.

There was no further business to be brought before the Voters'.

Jared Froetschner moved to adjourn. Mike Reagle seconded and the motion passed by voice vote. Meeting was closed with singing The Doxology.
