Who am I? Ever ask a question like that? Have you ever wondered how you fit into God's schemes of things at this moment in your life? I came across a story about a distressed elderly man who was in this very situation. He poured out his heart to his pastor one day saying, "If only I could find myself! Even after 70 years of life I still actually wonder who I am or where I fit in!" The pastor thought a moment, then reached for an old worn catechism. While doing so, he said: "John, there are times when I feel the same way, wondering who I am and how I could possibly fit into God's schemes of things. When I begin feeling that way, I always reach for my catechism and read Martin Luther's explanation of the three articles of the Apostles' Creed."

And then he began to read slowly,

I believe that God has made <u>me</u>... I believe that Jesus Christ...has redeemed <u>me</u>...that I may be His <u>own</u>...and serve Him...I believe that...the Holy Spirit has called <u>me</u> by the Gospel...and will at the Last Day raise up <u>me</u>... and give to <u>me</u>...eternal life. This is most certainly true.

As they continued to talk, the elderly man began to see himself not as a lonely speck floating from here to there, but as a unique creation of God, a God who was interested in him, who knew him, who loved him, who had sent His Son into the world to make him one of His very own. He became aware of a definite relationship between himself and the Lord who was not only his Creator but also his personal Redeemer and Comforter. He saw who he was through Christ – God's very own child – with a purpose!

It may seem odd to reach for the Apostles' Creed for mental and spiritual therapy. But is it really odd, or is it something we have been taught to do and never really did? A careful, prayerful study of the creed and the catechism will tell us who we are, what we are here for, and where we are going. Try it some time! You might actually answer some of those questions you have about your life.

In January a Sign Committee was formed to investigate the possibly of Trinity having an LED sign to replace the deteriorating sign on the front lawn. Those on the Committee are Michael Reagle, Kevin Lampe, Tonya Chmielewski, Curt Kinney, Marty Nusser and Suzanne Hewes.

The Sign Committee considered several options. First option was using the brick from the original sign built in 1972. Some of the brick is damaged and the cost to remove brick by brick would be expensive. The Lampe family, whose memorial built the sign, volunteered to remove the sign brick by brick and perhaps use the brick on the church property. Second option was to buy an LED sign and hire a brick layer and use excess brick from the East Ed Wing. Again, the price was very costly. The committee contacted Illuminous Neon Sign and was given a quote for both the LED sign and faux stone all inclusive.

The quote from Illuminous Neon Sign was for \$69,718.15 for the complete sign. A 50% down payment on the contract to Illuminous by August 23, 2018 is required to begin the project. Trinity is responsible for the electrical work. The highest bid for the electrical work is \$5821. Quotes for the electrical work are ongoing. The total for the sign and electrical work could be \$75,529.15. This proposal was presented to the Voters on June 28, 2018. The Voters approved \$76,000 for the LED sign.

There is \$17,120 for the LED sign from memorial funds and prior Endowment allocations. The Endowment Board has allocated \$20,000 to be matched by the congregation for the sign which brings the fund to \$37,120. Suggested ways to raise remaining funds are campaigns, challenges, pledges, Endowment and LCEF (Lutheran Church Extension Fund) loan. The Sign Committee is starting a campaign to raise the remaining funds necessary for the LED sign. Watch the bulletin for more information as it becomes available.


