

SHARE CHRIST † SERVE CHRIST Paul's letter to Timothy is oftentimes called a "Pastor Epistle." In other words, Paul writes his letter to those who are called to shepherd God's people. Pastors are called "to be fit" in the Word of the Lord, so that they might preach the Gospel of Christ crucified and risen. Prayer is to be a natural part of the Pastor's life. Finally, the Pastor is called to model the faith to others in both his words and deeds.

No doubt, Pastors need to keep recharging their own batteries. In my own personal life, this happens most mornings as I enter through the office doors and walk directly into the sanctuary, kneel on the prayer kneeler, open the hymnal and bible and begin receiving God's gift for the day. Although harder to accomplish, this practice is also a joy in the evening through prayer with my family. And final, I look forward to receiving the true body and blood of Christ in the bread and wine at the Sacrament.

In Word and Sacrament, Christ lives in us to forgive our sins and strengthen our faith. And, where Jesus is living, we, too, shall live forever!

To that end, the same holds true for you as well. Your "hope is set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people."

How are you then trained? Are you toiling and striving because you have that assured hope? Read this carefully: Christian education always begins in the home. It is further nurtured in the church.

Parenting begins with parents remembering that they live in God's Kingdom ruled by God's love in Christ. The Gospel is the basis for parenting, not some how-to book with a list of rules. God's undeserved love in Christ reminds parents that having a child is not a right but a blessing. Parents do not merely produce children (as an industry produces a product). They are entrusted with a child as a gift from God. All parenting flows from this gift of the heavenly Father...The ultimate goal of Christian parents are to see their children in heaven, not the 'Hall of Fame'. (The Lutheran Study Bible, p. 2025).

At Trinity, everything we do is revolved around this ultimate goal; Salvation. Rally Day, on Sunday, September 9th is a great day to begin this training. This day focuses on getting people into God's Word and equipping them to lead a godly life. Christian people and parents, young and old—get yourself to worship and Bible study! Sunday morning is not a day to sleep in or a time to be off doing something else—it is a time to "rest in the Lord." Opportunities for further study will be present at our mid-week on Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm. Devotions also exist as the "heartbeat of daily life." Carve out time in your busy schedules for personal Bible reading and prayer.

Enjoy work, vacation, sporting activities, and home projects, but put them in the proper perspective and in the relationship where they belong with Christ always coming first. Yes, Christ is our hope in this present life and for the life that is to come!



The Voter's graciously approved a loan from Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) for \$50,000.

The contract with Luminous Neon has been signed. Davis Electric will be responsible for the electrical work and a contract has been signed.

It will take approximately 6 weeks for Luminous Neon to obtain all city permits and Luminous Neon to build the LED sign.

The LED Sign Committee is Michael Reagle, Melanie Algrim, Curt Kinney, Tonya Chmielewski, Kevin Lampe, Marty Nusser, and Suzanne Hewes.

The display in the lobby illustrates the amount toward the purchase. Of the \$76,000 necessary, we have \$44,000 from contributions, memorials and Endowment.
