

Christ's seven signs take us on a journey beginning with a wedding feast in Cana and ending with the resurrection of Lazarus. During our time together, we will see the incredible events of the following Seven Signs:

The Seven Signs

Changing water into wine (John 2:1–11)
Healing the royal official's son (John 4:46–54)
Healing the paralyzed man (John 5:1–15)
Feeding the five thousand (John 6:5–14)
Walking on water (John 6:16–21)
Healing the man born blind (John 9)
Raising Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1–45)

Individually, each sign points to Christ's identity—He is God incarnate. Looking at them all together, the signs prove that Jesus is the Son of God who exercises all power in heaven and on earth. The signs also move forward in intensity and end with a great crescendo—from water and wine to Christ's defeat of death!

John tells us why he records these signs. "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31). It is from these verses that we learn several important ideas:

John's account of the signs is selective; he mentions that Jesus did many other signs. The signs were included so we "believe"—a verb appearing ninety-seven times in John. The goal of the signs is for us to believe that Jesus is the Christ and Son of God. This belief leads to life—a theme in John's Gospel, which is mentioned fifty-three times.


I therefore encourage you to join us for this time of fellowship and Bible Study. If you are looking for a "sign" from Jesus, this just may be it!

#### TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT BOARD ANNUAL REPORT

#### FROM THE ENDOWMENT BOARD TO THE MEMBERS AND FRIENDS OF TRINITY:

This Endowment fund exists for three primary purposes. First, to provide a proven mechanism for promoting exceptional or generational giving to the church. Second, providing stewardship and wise investment of these gifts observing and noting that the Endowment Fund is a method of building up God's Church on Earth in an organized and structured fashion. Thirdly, the Fund is operated by the members of the Board who dutifully and prayerfully allocate the income from the fund for annual ministry projects all as governed by our Constitution and enabling By-laws of Trinity.

Thus, we present to you the Annual Statement. Trinity, its members, and family have received greatly. In turn, it is up to those granted allocations to wisely and purposefully utilize those allocations to proclaim God's saving grace and to be the hands that nourish the seeds of faith. Remember, one short way to remember our Stewardship obligation is that stewardship is all that we do and say, after we say, 'I believe'. Let's remember the Endowment in our stewardship and let's put to work the gifts received from our God.

The Endowment Board met on Monday February 21, 2022, for the purpose of reviewing the financials, determining annual income and providing allocation of that income for ministry projects. The 2021 Income was determined to be \$166,724. The Treasurer reported that there was a future projects fund and unused 2020 allocations of \$82,187. After full discussion, the Board decided to allocate and recommend to the Voters Assembly that 2022 allocations be as provided on Attachment A hereto.

The Board unanimously created a future projects fund of \$42,574. The Board voted unanimously to not capitalize any funds in 2022. There will be a vacancy on the Board as of June 30, 2022. Judy Nusser advised that after 25 years of faithful service to the Board, she will not be seeking another term. Thus, the Board and Voters Assembly should prayerfully receive and consider nominations to fill this soon to be vacant position on the Endowment Board.

The Voters should recognize that the Endowment has fully funded all TIG Ministry current costs as well as 2023. The Centennial Committee will have adequate funds to celebrate Trinity's 100-year Centennial events.

This year the Endowment mission and mission outreach in Africa, Haiti, and the Dominican Republic. New allocations from the Board include support of the Lutheran Hour and Lutheran Public Radio. Two other new groups received allocations, those being the Global Orphan Project and Lutherans for Life Teams.

The Endowment Fund is a youthful 25 years old. The Endowment Board allocated funds to cover cost overruns in the refurbishing of the Fellowship Hall, reduce short term debt and provided sufficient funds for new projectors in the Sanctuary deemed vital for worship. Operating assistance was given to support the new music ministry and our existing called servants. God has truly blessed Trinity.

The Endowment Fund is demonstrating the Biblical principles of being good stewards of the gifts that have been given from others and through the collective work and generational giving from our church membership. This Board is committed to being good stewards of this fund and to work with God's people in building upon the resources of His Church on earth. The next annual meeting is likely in February, 2023 at a date and time to be determined.
