This exasperated the girl, who was tired and hungry. "Daddy," she said with a sigh, "whycan't we just pray once a week? Why do we have to ask for our daily bread every day?"

Her older brother, wiser and eager to set her straight, weighed in before the dad could answer. "You don't think we want stale bread, do you?" he said.

Inadvertently, that fellow was confirming the importance of regular prayer. See if the next story hits home.

Little four year old Melinda's favorite story was "The Three Little Pigs" which she asked her mom or dad to read every single night before bed. They gladly obliged, but after several months, her father got a bright idea. He recorded the story on tape and told her to simply press "play" before jumping under the covers. She resisted.

"But, honey," her daddy told her, "you can still hear it."

"Yes," she replied, "but I can't sit in its lap."

Amazingly, God the Father is eager to spend time with us. The way we can experience conversation and communion with Him is through personal and corporate prayer.

Sometimes we pray...usually it happens after some tragedy or when we need something badly. The Bible tells us to do so...It says, "Pray always" (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Sometimes we even pray for others. Sometimes those prayers, are hard. We ask, "What should I say? Will my prayer be proper and pleasing to God?"

"Our Father," not "my Father." We're all in this together so think of someone beside yourself when you pray. "Our Father who art in heaven." Earthly fathers disappoint us, everyone does. "In heaven" means He's able to do far more than any earthly person we've ever had any experience with.

"Hallowed be Thy Name." God's name is all He's revealed to us about Himself, that He's Triune, Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier, all that's in the Creed. May the person for whom I pray treasure everything God has revealed about Himself.

Oh Lord, my God, When I in awesome wonder

Consider all the works Thy hands have made

I see the stars, I hear the mighty thunder

Thy power throughout the universe displayed

Then sings my soul, my Savior God to Thee, How great Thou art, how great Thou art Then sings my soul, my Savior God to Thee, How great Thou art, how great Thou art

"How great Thou art" without a doubt would top most favorite hymn surveys. The powerful description in the song can't help but make one feel humbled by the incredible works of our God and the powerful feeling of comfort knowing He is there waiting for us when we are called to our Eternal home, and the price that was paid to get us there.

The hymn originated in Sweden as a poem by Lutheran lay preacher Carl Boberg in 1886 and published in a local newspaper. Over the years the words made their way to music in different congregations and Boberg published the poem again, this time with music in 1891. By the early 1900's it had been translated and published in Russian, German and English.

His inspiration for the poem came while Boberg was walking home from church near <u>Kronobäck</u>, Sweden. While listening to the church bells a sudden storm made its appearance and just as quickly subsided into a peaceful calm. Wind, thunder and rain turned to rainbow all while the church bells rang out over the meadow.

The version we use in the LSB today by Stuart K. Hine was introduced to them in Russian while Hine and his wife were serving as missionaries in the Ukraine. The third and fourth stanzas we sing are not translations but are original to Hine. Ministering to a Russian soldier's widowed wife who was the first in her village to be able to read and to homeless refugees in Britain during World War II was his inspiration to adapt the poem to what we sing today.



Treasurers Report: YTD in August we are behind by about \$19k. With only one Sunday left in September, we will most likely be about \$25k behind from the previous year. Financials have been adjusted for the corrections that were needed. Ater the adjustments, we have a \$77k deficit. The TIG salary still needs to be adjusted to zero which makes the loss around \$62k. \$49,500 is still to be allocated from the Endowment that either has been or will be spent this year. After the adjustments were made to the correct years, the previous year shows an income of \$26k. Jay requested that there needs to be more discussion before any large expenses occur.

Old Business:

Staff Health Insurance: Jay discussed insurance options with focus on HSA-A and HSA-B plus dental and vision plans. Jerry motioned to approve HSA-A and Jana seconded. No discussion. Motion approved.

New Business:

Endowment Update: Endowment had a special meeting. We had a request for a grant and there was a need to discuss the TIG Ministry for 2024. We received an additional allocation from the Endowment of \$2,300 to help cover TIG for 2023. \$22,600 is our 20% share of the TIG Ministry.

Elders: The schedule is out for the worship assistants. There will always be an elder present at Communion.

Properties: Lance replaced the freezer. The refrigerator had to be fixed as well. The kids toilet in the preschool restroom has been replaced. The sink next to the fridge needs to be fixed as well. The lock for the entry to the preschool hallway needs to be replaced.

ABCD: We will have an intern from Hays for this semester.
