Teach the faith at home.

After Jesus' birth, He is presented at the temple and Zechariah and Anna witness their Savior. The wise men from the far East come to witness the birth of the new King, and the revelation of God to the Gentiles. We can teach our children to fish, hunt, or build a house, but have you taught the faith at home? Proverbs 22:6 "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it"

Martin Luther wrote: "It is because of His humanity and His incarnation that Christ becomes sweet to us, and through Him God becomes sweet to us. Let us therefore begin to ascend step by step from Christ's crying in His swaddling clothes up to His Passion. Then we shall easily know God. I am saying this so that you do not begin to contemplate God from the top but start with the weak elements. We should busy ourselves completely with treating, knowing, and considering this man. Then you will know that He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

Like many children in our families, Mary and Joseph cherished the gift of God in this child. The greatest gift to humanity is the incarnation of the

Son of God. Children are a gift and a blessing to a marriage. We cherish them in training them, loving them, we have been entrusted with their care. Our good stewardship begins when we bring them to the waters of Holy Baptism, raise them in the love of God and teach them Scripture and His ways.

We teach children, guide teenagers and council young adults.

Dear Christian, teach the faith at home as you would teach them how to fish, farm, or even speak. It's the only way thy will be able to make their way in this fallen world. Under your tutelage, they will be able to face the world with their eyes fixed on Jesus. Let them learn from you. How do you react in the midst of trials and tribulation. Let them see that you seek the Lord. When calamities and deception arrive, let them see that you call upon the Lord, in prayer and supplication. Let them see that you open your Bible to seek God's wisdom and direction. Let them see that you praise the Lord and worship Him in thankfulness for all His blessings upon you. Let them see that you rejoice at the gathering for worship. In this way they will learn to worship and call upon their Lord and Savior as well. Trusting the Lord almighty is faithful to deliver them, heal them and save them from the hands of the enemy. They will be able to call upon the Lord who is faithful to his promise given to them in their Baptism. They are God's children, and they should sing and confess out loud, I am Baptized into Christ.

And when your children grow older and leave the nest, trust the Lord your Savior who is faithful and will be faithful to His promise. He will watch over his dear children, entrusted to your care. Trust their Baptism and the one who calls them His own. And when they return to the Lord from wandering in the world, welcome them with open arms in the love of God. Chief of sinners though I be, Jesus shed His blood for me. Died that I might live on high, Lives that I might never die.

As the branch is to the vine, I am His, and He is mine.

William McComb was a 19th century poet, political activist and Irish cartoonist. The words for the hymn "Chief of Sinners Though I Be" appeared in *The Original Secession Magazine* (1856) and in *Lyra Britannica* (1867). A few small changes occurred when published in our hymnals now to ensure the text does not limit the power of the Savior.

The lyrics express the faith of a forgiven sinner. In 1 Timothy 1:15 St. Paul describes himself as "chief" of sinners (ESV text says "foremost"). The hymn tells us to confess to Jesus, because of what He has done for us (1 John 1:7, John 1:5, Galatians 2:20).

The second stanza can remind of us the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin (Romans 8) with the words "Love that found me - wondrous thought! Found me when I sought Him not."

Stanza 3 brings in Romans 5, giving us "peace" that flows, "joy" that lifts the soul, "faith" and "hope" that we will walk with God.

The last two stanzas Come back to 1 Timothy and also Colossians 3:11 "Christ is all, and in all". And Philippians 4:19 "My God will supply every need of yours". All these are reminders of God's unwavering love and forgiveness, words to read or sing when we may feel like we are falling short.

Zechariah: Your Kingdom Come!

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. For Trinity, Garden City, it will begin on "Ash Tuesday", February 13 th . On Saturday and Sundays during this Lenten season we will begin to explore God's Word through the writing of the Prophet Zechariah whose chief concern is God's kingdom. Throughout all fourteen chapters, Zechariah joyfully announces that God's kingdom is coming through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The book of Zechariah abounds with stunning portraits of our Savior. Jesus serves as the prophet's Interpreting Messenger throughout the first six chapters. Zechariah calls Jesus a "Sprout" (3:8; 6:12), "Servant" (3:8) and "Stone" (3:9). It is in his last six chapters, though, that the prophet describes Jesus in much more compelling ways. Jesus is righteous and humble (9:9). His blood of the covenant sets prisoners free (9:11). He is the church's Cornerstone, Tent Peg and Battle Bow (10:4). Then, in a dramatic twist of fate, Christ is detested (11:8), sold for thirty pieces of silver (11:12), struck so his sheep scatter (13:7) and finally pierced and killed (12:10). In the end, however, God's kingdom comes—finally and permanently, in pristine beauty (14:9, 16, 17).


