The Most Valuable Work...

What's "Most" important? It might be a good exercise to ask that question to your family while traveling the Kansas roads this summer. "What do you think is the most important thing in the whole world?" Then take notes. You can probably guess that Jesus would be on the top of that list, at least for those who are reading this short devotion. While you are taking notes I'd encourage you to see how that may line up with your Monday activities. Then see how it may align with your Tuesday – Friday activities. What about Saturday? This Sunday?

Recently, I was reading a Luther sermon on the Estate of Marriage. In it Luther proclaimed saying:

But this at least all married people should know. They can do no better work and do nothing more valuable either for God, for Christendom, for all the world, for themselves, and for their children than to bring up their children well.... If we want to help Christendom, we most certainly have to start with the children, as happened in earlier times....False natural love blinds parents so that they have more regard for the bodies of their children than they have for their souls....Therefore, it is of the greatest importance for every married man to pay closer, more thorough, and continuous attention to the health of his child's soul than to the body which he has begotten, and to regard his child as nothing else but an eternal treasure God has commanded him to protect, and so prevent the world, the flesh, and the devil from stealing the child away and bringing him to destruction. For at his death and on the Day of Judgment he will be asked about his child and will have to give a most solemn account.

What is "Most" important? I know the answer and so do you. However, knowing is different than living in that answer. Maybe I need to pay a more closer, thorough and continuous attention to the health of my loved ones' souls. My loved ones are truly an eternal treasure that God has gifted me with in order to protect by using His Gospel Word. Our Lord uses us as individuals to protect our loved ones from the world, our flesh and Satan. To protect them from eternal destruction. Do we protect them with macaroni and cheese so they can grow and be stars in the world? Or do we protect them with the words, Christ has died, Christ is Risen and Christ will come again!

Again, what do those Monday through Sunday activities look like? Are they body centered or soul centered? Keep on protecting!

Music News



The History of the LCMS Hymnals

The *Kirchengesangbuch* was the very first hymnal created for the LCMS back in 1847. The text was written in German, and there was no music, just words. The music was saved for the organist or perhaps someone leading the singing. It was around this time also that there was a movement to bring the original, rugged style of singing the hymns, more original to the time of the Reformation.

Evangelical Lutheran Hymn-Book, the Missouri Synods first hymnal in English, came out in 1912. A group of English-speaking Lutherans had developed their own hymnal and gifted it to the Missouri Synod when they joined. CPH then published it both as text only and with the music.

Through World War I both the German and English hymnals were used. In 1941 *The Lutheran Hymnal* became the hymnal. This version included harmonizations for singing parts and people were not interested! There are records of people making the comments, "We're Lutherans! Why would the congregation sing in parts? That's what the Methodists do!"

In the 1970's and 80's came out *Lutheran Worship*. The plan was for that hymnal to replace the *Lutheran Hymnal* but it failed to take over and until the development of the *Lutheran Service Book* in 2006, the LCMS was a two-hymnal Synod.

This brings us to the *Luther Service Book* whose main purpose was to bring the Missouri Synod churches back to using one hymnal. New hymns, music and new liturgies brought the best of the old and added to the new. The new addition of the *LSB* was released in 2006.

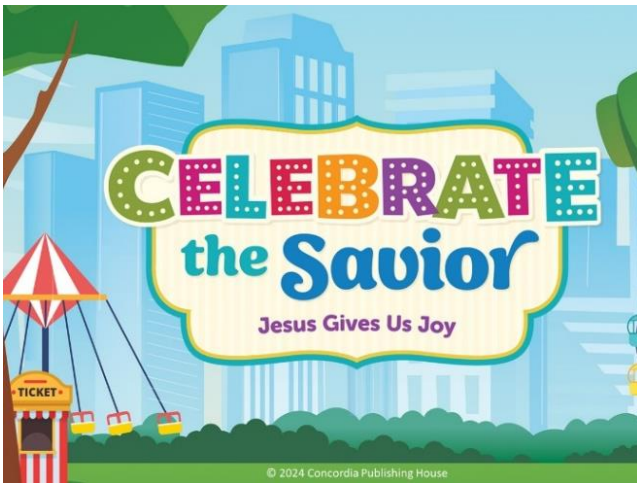
